- Transition Support from the Army overwhelming supported at all levels, however there
  is a need to raise the awareness of the Transition pro-cons, by communication of whatwhen how with the process. There is an understanding that not all individuals'
  circumstances are the same which impacts on the management of their transition
  contract (discharge/resignation)
- Bibliography there needs to be more communications across the board to raise the awareness and who the manager is, how he captures information and how its catalogued
- The Associations position on the RCB has not changed, still supportive going forward
- MIA North Korea Working Group, the report from Director Stephen Dunn was accepted.
  The President reinforced that progress is very slow however there has been some
  mutual support from both North Korea and South Korea with assistants in resolving this
  matter. There are many topography and artificial objects, that need to be addressed
  before moving forward IE minefields
- The report on the RAR NMW The Annual Report was forward to all Associations. The NMW is in a sound position and continue to be supported from 6 & 8/9 RAR as required. The 7 BDE COMD is also supportive of the NMW

  - Some more financial than others

  - There is a spike in the cyber space online. There needs to be more effort put into securing websites and payment portals, use of encrypted bank accounts, due to the increasing attention of domestic and offshore hackers, including the use of Gmail
  - IT Consideration needs to be given to bring the whole of the "RAR Association" under one domain along with the unit associations. Andrew Shea and David French will do the research and make a report to the Board. It is believed this will have mutual benefits for all Association; cost, security and perhaps sponsoring
